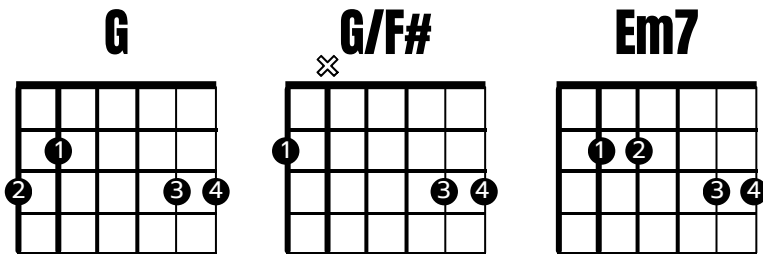


# Songbird by Oasis

**Intro: G | G**

**Rest of Song: G | G | G | G - G/F# | Em | Em | Em | Em - G/F#**

## song structure

**Intro > Chorus > Chorus > Bridge > Chorus > Solo > Chorus**

## tips

- Released in 2002 this is one of the only Oasis songs written by Liam Gallagher instead of his brother Noel.
- Essentially it is a 2 chord song using G and Em7 with the G/F# acting as a brief passing chord between them.
- As it is 4/4 time you can keep the strumming simple with 4 down strums each bar. The actual strumming pattern used in the song is a bit more complex - as is the timing of the passing chord - so chat to your tutor about the best way to play this.
- Although essentially a G to Em song all of the chords keep the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> finger on the 3<sup>rd</sup> fret of the B and top E strings which is a common trick used by Oasis and many other artists. This means the G we use is a slightly different voicing to the most basic G. It also means our Em becomes an Em7.
